## What Makes a Great Subcontractor? The Ten Traits GCs Trust Most

In construction, the difference between a smooth project and a chaotic one often comes down to the quality of the subcontractors on site. A great subcontractor isn't just someone who completes their scope – they're a partner who protects the schedule, communicates clearly, and helps the general contractor deliver a successful project.

Whether you're a GC evaluating bids or a specialty trade aiming to stand out, these are the qualities that consistently define top-tier subcontractors.

### 1. Clear, Consistent Communication

Ask any superintendent what they value most, and you'll hear the same answer: communication. The best subcontractors don't disappear after the award. They:

- Confirm scope and expectations
- Flag conflicts early
- Coordinate with other trades
- Provide regular updates on manpower and progress

### 2. A Complete, Transparent Scope

A strong subcontractor eliminates surprises. They:

- Mobilize when they say they will
- Bring the right crew size
- Maintain reliable equipment

### 4. Quality Work That Passes the First Time

Rework kills momentum. High-performing subcontractors:

- Follow manufacturer and UL requirements
- Self-inspect before calling for official inspections
- Maintain clean, organized work areas
- Deliver work that meets or exceeds specifications

*GCs quickly learn which 'subs' they can trust to get it right the first time.*

### 5. Respect for the Schedule

A good subcontractor understands how their work fits into the bigger picture. They:

- Know the critical path
- Coordinate with steel, MEP, and finishing trades
- Adapt when sequencing shifts
- Keep the GC informed of any impacts
